

## **missio: Kids, Reopening Frequently Asked Questions...**

- **As a volunteer, do I need to wear a mask?**
  - Yes, missio: Kids will provide you with a mask on the morning that you serve. We ask that you use the provided mask.
- **Does my child need to wear a mask?**
  - In keeping with the CDC recommendations, the state mandate, and the Woodmen Hills contract, all children 3 years of age and older are asked to wear a mask while attending missio: Kids or the main service.
- **What if my child has a school issued/doctor issued note allowing him/her to be exempt from wearing a mask?**
  - As hard as this is, at this time we are asking everyone attending in person service to adhere to the CDC recommendations, the state mandate, and the Woodmen Hills building contract. If you are not able to comply, we invite you to join us online at our [missio: Kids YouTube channel](#). We are hopeful for an end to this season soon!
- **Can I bring my other kids in the classroom when my spouse and I are serving?**
  - Would you like to bring them in the classroom with you? We can make arrangements for that if needed.
- **Why are there little to no toys?**
  - In order to maintain best practice during this season, we decided to provide quality content through the Gospel Project for the entirety of the hour and fifteen minute service. This means the children will be engaged with preplanned activities (singing, videos, coloring, prayer, memory verses, crafts) as opposed to free play. When the weather is nice, we will take the kids to the park.
- **Why don't you have a class open for my child?**
  - The answer is two fold. First, our hope during this phased re-opening is to better train parents and volunteers on classroom instruction through the Gospel Project and classroom management. We desire excellence and safety so that the Gospel can be proclaimed without distraction or fear. Second, we hope to establish a clear vision of what it means to partner with parents to make disciples in this season. This ministry is fully supported by volunteers and we welcome and view this as an opportunity, not an obstacle. So, as volunteers allow classrooms to open, we will re-open!
- **When do you plan to open all the classrooms?**
  - As with all things this season, it is hard to say. Our desire is to gradually open classrooms as parents and volunteers allow for this ministry to thrive.
- **Why are you capping classroom sizes?**
  - In order to do our best with classroom social distancing, individual care, and safety, we feel that capping classrooms will allow for the best experience for both children and volunteers. We are accepting 8 regular attending family slots and 3 newcomer slots every week for our 3's and 6 regular attending family slots and 2 newcomer slots every week for our 2's. We are committed to having a volunteer to child ratio that is below that of government recommendations.
- **What is the missio: Kids sick policy?**
  - **Within the last 24 hours...**

- illness being treated with antibiotics for less than 24 hours
- vomiting or diarrhea in the last 24 hours
- fever greater than 99° in the last 24 hours
- sore throat, cough, or unknown rash
- **In addition to the above and in response to COVID-19...**
  - Is anyone showing flu-like symptoms?
  - Has anyone had a fever of 100.4 or higher in the past 14 days?
  - Has anyone been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19?
  - Do you feel there is any medical reason to not be around others?
  - If anyone in your party answered yes to any of these questions, we strongly encourage you to join misiso: Kids online through our [YouTube channel](#).
- **Will I have to RSVP for misiso: Kids every week?**
  - Yes, registration will open every Monday before the following Sunday and close Saturday at noon. Class sizes are limited.
- **What if my child gets sick Saturday night? Should I cancel my RSVP? How do I cancel my RSVP?**
  - Yes, we would ask that you please cancel your RSVP as soon as possible by emailing [brittney@missiodeifalcon.org](mailto:brittney@missiodeifalcon.org). We hope to see you next week and super sorry you have a sick kiddo! We will be praying for you!
- **Will I be able to drop my kid off directly in the classroom?**
  - Yes, but we are asking that families maintain social distancing and follow a single direction flow of traffic.
- **What extra measures will be taken to disinfect classrooms?**
  - All high touch points will be cleaned and sanitized before and after service. Rooms have been modified by eliminating toys and furnishings.
- **Will hand sanitizer be provided?**
  - Hand sanitizer will be provided when you check your child in and out of the classroom.
